FLCRC had another EPIC year! In 2023, we served 305 families, 115 crime victims and over 800 individuals. We presented 11 scholarships totaling \$5,300 at our 7th Annual Banquet in December. The sold-out event was a wonderful opportunity to look back at the past year with appreciation and gratitude, and to share a preview of 2024 with great anticipation and excitement.

One of the most memorable experiences in 2023 was our international trip to the **Dominican Republic**. In July, 22 Y.A.L.E. leaders along with FLCRC staff and volunteers spent five days in the beautiful Caribbean country doing volunteer work, learning about the history and culture, and much more. 



Please rate your overall experience with FLCRC programs and services:




Which programs or services did you participate in? Please rate each based on your overall experience.
